Dear Judge Quinn:

We are co-counsel for Plaintiffs and write to provide the Court with an update on the settlement of this matter and to request a 25-day extension of the March 9, 2026, deadline for class members to object to the settlement. Defendant consents to Plaintiffs' extension request.

To date, the proposed settlement has received an overwhelmingly positive response from class members, with 20,118 claims filed, four opt-outs and zero objections received. Pursuant to the Court's Order Granting Plaintiffs' Motion for Preliminary Approval of Class Action Settlement [Dkt. No. 66], all briefs and materials in support of final approval of the settlement as well as Settlement Class Counsel's fee and expense application, and any application for Service Awards to Class Plaintiffs, were to be filed no later than 14 days before the objection deadline. Plaintiffs respectfully request that the Court extend the objection deadline through April 3, 2026, to provide class members with additional time to object to the settlement based on the final approval and fee motions, which Plaintiffs will file by March 20, 2026.

The requested extension, if granted, will not prejudice Defendant or class members and will not result in any delay of these proceedings, including the final approval hearing set for July 14, 2026. Should the Court grant the requested extension, Settlement Class Counsel will direct the Settlement Administrator to update the Settlement Website and toll-free Settlement hotline to advise class members of the new deadline to object to the Settlement. In addition, Settlement Class Counsel will also direct the Settlement Administrator to accept any objection that is submitted

through April 3, 2026, and direct all counsel fielding class member inquiries to facilitate the processing of any such objection through that date. Plaintiffs submit that there is good cause to extend the objection deadline in order to ensure that class members have a full opportunity to exercise their right to object to the Settlement, should they so desire, while maintaining the current final approval hearing date.

If this request meets with Your Honor's approval, please kindly So Order this letter and return it to the Parties through the Court's ECF system. We thank Your Honor for your continued attention to this matter.
